Nicholas Young analyzes the social structure of the Underground Railroad Network (UGRR) of New York State. He views the UGRR as a social movement and insurgency as a socially-constructed entrepreneurial effort. Young also argues that enslaved African Americans relied on network contacts and bridged structural holes to identify, recognize, and formulate an entrepreneurial social movement organization (ESMO) that would aid in their management of the UGRR.
